

## The Pennsylvania Cave Database

The Pennsylvania cave database is a collection of data about Pennsylvania caves. There are two different copies of the database. One is stored at Penn State, a subset is stored on my personal computer.

The concept of the database has been approved by M.A.R.

Most of the data has been gleaned from published reports; a lesser amount has been supplied to me directly. Numerous persons have sent me updates, however, the most frequent contributor is Jim Kennedy.

Contents There are 50 some items per cave in the database at Penn State and 45 in the database on the personal computer. I dispensed with some items in order to store the database on a floppy diskette. Survey data is not stored in the database. Here is a partial list of items on the database.

<u>Uses</u> The list of restricted caves elsewhere in this issue was prepared from the database. Lists can be prepared for caves in a specific geographical region; lists can be prepared, as they were, to aid the Pa. Game Commission in their small mammal survey; data sheets can be prepared for caves in a specific locale or for other attributes.

Recipients of Lists I will honor requests from any legitimate caving group or responsible caver. I am particularly interested in helping those who in turn send me updates for the database. I cannot honor requests to print a complete set of data from the database. Nor will I supply a set of the data on floppy diskette unless it has been approved by M.A.R. If I politely refuse your request, please take it up with M.A.R., I don't mind.

Updates The data in the database is only as good as you want it to be. Send me updates and reports of new caves. Look at the list above to determine what is needed. (If you're really serious, I will send you a data collection manual and data collection forms.) I welcome any bit of information about any

Pennsylvania cave. Well, almost. If you have information about your own secret cave, please keep it to yourself. The database is public information.

Number of Caves Not all known caves are in the database; only the ones I know about are there. In March 1987, there were 978 caves in the database. This includes caves which no longer exist (quarried away, for example); caves which are physically closed; and cave segments intersected by mine tunnels. In such cases, the length shown is only that of cave passages, not the total length of the mine.

Some Technical Stuff I use the database management software called KnowledgeMan/2 by MDBS of Lafayette, IN. The data file consists of 251,610 bytes (characters). There is a separate file to store information about cave life; it is currently empty.

Where to Send Updates & Requests Currently all requests are honored from the database on my personal computer. Donations are graciously accepted to help defray paper & postage costs (if you're requesting information).
