CAMPING: The Fairgrounds has primitive camping; no hookups, no electric, but there is parking for RVs. Motels are available in Shippensburg, about 8 miles away.

Gear washing (not decon level) will be available.

Fires are allowed, with appropriate restraint and precautions.

Dogs are allowed; please be able to clean up after them.

Alcohol is allowed (ignore the Fairground signs to the contrary), but is **BYO**.

CAVING: Many caving trips are being planned, including WV Panhandle caves Silers and Cricket Maze. A Guidebook will be provided. Several trips are "led" trips to sensitive caves and limited in number. Signup sheets for these trips will be available starting Friday afternoon.

and Sunday morning during the field meet! Bald Eagle Grotto was uncertain of the number of presale breakfast tickets sold through registration; therefore they provided the PCC with \$200 as an estimate. There were also 15 cash sales during the morning of the breakfast, along with a 26 cent donation to the PCC. A total of \$278.26 was collected for breakfast and coffee sales, \$240.26 for PCC breakfasts and \$38 for MAKC coffee sales. Supplies for the PCC breakfast were donated by Dave Briggs, John Boswell, as well as Karen and George Bange. Thanks to all of them for their generosity! The PCC officers indicated that a pancake breakfast will be provided at the upcoming 2019 Fall MAR field meet hosted by York Grotto.

OLD BUSINESS:

Project and Caves of Interest List:

Cold Air Cave (Northampton County) – no report. **Red Church Cave** (Schuylkill County, PA) – no report.

PCC Event Insurance: The PCC is not covered under the NSS insurance umbrella since it is not considered one of the NSS Internal Organizations (I.O.). The PCC will continue to investigate other avenues for liability coverage during conservation events. ** Post-meeting update: Per Carol Tiderman, all Conservancies affiliated with the NSS are covered by insurance.

Sarah Furnace Cave: Tom Metzgar reported MAKC is scheduled to close on the property May 31, 2019 and that most of the required funds have been raised. MAKC has additional information about the Sarah Furnace Cave property for those who are interested.

NEW BUSINESS:

Decker Sink Cleanup: Gary Dunmire requested the assistance of the PCC membership for a potential sinkhole cleanup in Centre County. Decker Sink is reported to take an estimated 60-80 gallon/hour water flow. The sink hole is full of trash, tires, and oil drums. A rope and pulley system may be required for the cleanup efforts due to the steep walls at the site. A significant amount of manpower will be required for this cleanup. Gary has been in contact with DCNR, Penns Valley Conservation Association, and Clearwater Conservancy regarding efforts to clean *Page 6*MAR Breakdown Volume 34 Number 2 August 2019

this sink hole. Gary is hoping for a quick timeline and something to be coordinated within the next few weeks. He will provide the PCC with updates as they become available.

*** Post Meeting Note from Gary Dunmire May 20, 2019: Matt Beaver from DCNR indicated that hands-on cleanup with volunteers in the Decker sink hole will be postpone until a later time, perhaps a late fall (leaf off) or early next spring. ***
