## 2023 Spring MAR Field Meet Shade Gap, PA

It had been seven years since the Franklin County Grotto had hosted an MAR Meet in the spring (May 2016), and I wondered what challenges we might face if the FCG

wanted to host the event again. However, at the January 16, 2023 grotto meeting, we decided to move forward and immediately a team formed and started making progress. Returning to Shade Gap, Huntingdon County, and Harpers Memorial Park (Shade Gap VFD) was our first choice because the site offers good camping, adequate parking, numerous pavilions, a stage, bathrooms and showers, and nearby caves.

Much of the planning was accomplished at bi-weekly on-line meetings in January, February and March, but the team also had site visits at Harpers Park to iron out the details for camping and meals. Registration was up and running by mid-February, and event notifications were sent to the NSS News, MAR and other grottoes.

A small stumbling block was encountered, when we found that we could not host the Gauntlet rope course at Harpers Park. That obstacle was overcome, when we found an off-site location.

Nothing, however, could prepare us for the next occurrence which was the untimely death of Gordy Ley on April 15, 2023. His obituary for the NSS News is attached (*see page 3*).

When the MAR Meet was held on May 5-7, 2023, we were fortunate to have good weather and an excellent turnout. With 214 people in attendance, this was the largest MAR-only event to date. Many folks registered early; (136 Adults, 2 children (6-12 years) and 5 (5 & under), but we also had 70 Adults and 1 child who registered on site. The previous largest MAR was held by Nittany Grotto in 1998 and was their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration.

### In Memory of Gordon L. Ley

Gordon L."Gordy" Ley of Fairfield, PA, NSS # 39089, perished near the entrance to Fleming's Trough Spring Cave (PA) on April 15, 2023. He was in a low air-space crawlway and leading a group of four others on their way out of the cave, when the incident occurred. All others exited safely; CPR was administered to Gordy, but was unsuccessful.

Gordy had been actively caving with the Franklin County Grotto (FCG) since the 1990's and had served for many years as FCG's chairman, vicechairman and member-at-large. He was also active with Out-of-Bounds-Grotto and MAKC (Mid-Atlantic Karst Conservancy).

Gordy was **Enthusiastic**. He was always on the go with trips; regional events, local dig trips, beginner trips, photo trips, trips to West Virginia, Virginia, and TAG (Tennessee, Alabama & Georgia), cave gating projects, landowner contact trips. Because Gordy was enthusiastic, he generally had a "plan" and brought people along with him. The list of those who caved with Gordy is long.

Gordy was **Generous** with his time and talents. A remembrance, printed in the York Grotto Poop Sheet, from a fellow caver who was trained early on by Gordy, said that Gordy "gave a lot and asked nothing in return." Many others can say the same thing. He helped many people, offered advice and expertise, loaned gear and equipment and smoothed the way for others.

At the time of his passing, Gordy was less than two months short of his Seventieth birthday. He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Diane, two daughters and five grandchildren.

Dave Briggs volunteered to transport and store the PCC breakfast equipment until the next event.

**PCC Brochure:** Dave Briggs has the supply of PCC brochures. Anyone interested in obtaining brochures should contact Dave Briggs. Dave mentioned that the PCC may consider developing a digital brochure option in the future, perhaps utilizing a QR code.

**Christmas Cards:** Kim Kehs assumed the task of sending the PCC Christmas Cards beginning in 2018. Please contact Kim if you know of a landowner you would like added to the PCC Christmas card list.

**T-shirts:** The PCC t-shirts are not currently listed as available for purchase on the PCC web site. In the interest of moving some of the t-shirt inventory, John Boswell moved and Randy Hurst seconded to reduce the price of the shirts from \$15 to \$5. The motion passed. **PA Cave Database:** Paul Winter reported that he has been contacted about determining if known caves were present in areas of possible future construction sites. It was suggested that creating a type of "heat map" utility may be helpful for these type of inquiries. This approach would not reveal specific cave locations. Paul will continue to work on that effort.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

#### **Project and Caves of Interest List:**

**Cold Air Cave** (Northampton County) – no report.

**Penn Aqua Project Work:** Dave Briggs reported that about 12 volunteers reported to help with the Penn Aqua cleanup on April 22, 2023. George Bange coordinated the tasks and lots of productive work was accomplished. Volunteers cleared brush/fallen trees, completed stump removal, accomplished stone placement along the bank trail; and a retaining wall was constructed around the kiosk. It was a very successful day and volunteers were rewarded with a warm pot of chili at George and Karen's house afterward. Dave commented that there is the potential for more work at Penn Aqua cave in the future.

**Tytoona Cave Preserve:** Two work days have been completed at the Tytoona Preserve since the request at the February business meeting. Pittsburgh Grotto participated in an Earth Day project at the site. Additionally, a few people visited the site to do some trash cleanup during the 2023 Spring MAR. More work is to be done including repainting the parking area barrels, kiosk work to include paint and repair from buck shot damage, graffiti removal, possible trail cam installation, invasive plant species cleanup, etc. During a previous meeting, adding a QR code to the kiosk was suggested. It was pointed out that this would not be a good solution since there is currently no cell service at the cave.

**Thousand Steps of Lebanon County:** Steve Warnek reported that no one expressed interest to date for a cleanup at the Thousand Steps of Lebanon County site. Steve plans to set up a work date in the future and see if there is any interest at that time. Anyone interested in lending a hand should contact Steve for more details/information.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Fall MAR 2023: There is not currently a host for the 2023 fall field meet.

**2023 NSS Convention:** From June 26-30, 2023, the NSS will host the society's annual convention in Elkins, West Virginia. This week-long event includes extensive presentations across all disciplines related to cave science. Camping for the event will be available at the OTR site. PCC may want to consider having a table for the PCC at future NSS conventions to increase publicity. There is no charge to conservancies for a table at NSS Conventions, as long as no merchandise is sold.
